The Kempe Window

Arguably the single most important window in the Church is the Kempe Window, installed in the north Aisle in 1894. It is an outstanding example of design and craftsmanship from a nationally-renowned studio under the direction of Charles Eamer Kempe. It is attributed to John W Lisle, chief cartoonist and designer in the studio.

The window is in memory of twelve year-old Arthur Winslow, son of the much-loved Vicar, Charles de Blois Winslow, who drowned with his friend Norman Kruser on the Crosby shore in the summer of 1893. The window was restored in 2011-12.
